The Saxon Academy of Sciences and Humanities in Leipzig is seeking to fill the following position as soon as possible as part of the project *Archivum Alevicum: Ethnohistory of Alevi Communities in Anatolia, 16th–20th Century*:

Research associate (m/f/d) [position 01]

The project will reconstruct the only scarcely explored ethnohistory of the Alevis in Anatolia, focusing on the period from the 16th to the 20th century. It will examine settlement dynamics and the processes of community-building among Alevi groups, as well as their complex relationships with the state, Sunni Muslims, and non-Muslims. By innovatively combining a range of methods based on previously unconnected sources—including Ottoman archives, Alevi manuscripts, oral traditions, and material culture—a comprehensive virtual research environment will be developed. This environment will enable the reconstruction of the development of Alevi communities within the context of Ottoman social and religious history from the Early Modern Period to the Modern Era.

The position is initially limited to two years, with the prospect of continued employment for the duration of the project.

Scope of work: Full-time 100% (part-time generally possible)

Salary level: TV-L E 13

Place of work: Leipzig (mobile working possible on a daily basis by arrangement)

Your Responsibilities

- addressing systematic ethnohistorical research questions, in particular concerning a) settlement dynamics of Alevi communities and b) social and economic constellations of Alevi communities within and outside Alevi networks
- historical-philological work with documents and manuscripts (especially from the 15th to 19th centuries) and their editions; relating the data from historical documents to ethnographic data (especially from the 20th to 21st centuries)
- systematic collection of ethnohistorical data on Alevi settlements and groups as well as related villages, groups, individuals, etc.
- entering data into the virtual research environment
- translating, commenting on, and analysing data
- instructing student assistants in the collection and entry of data
- collaborating in the conception, writing, and editorial supervision of joint publications
- producing your own publications in the context of the project (working papers and journal articles; if employment is continued, also monographs)
- possibly, co-supervision of qualification theses

Your Profile

- PhD in Ottoman Studies, Turkish Studies, History, Islamic Studies, or a related discipline (habilitation possible in the context of the project)
- comprehensive proficiency in modern Turkish and Ottoman Turkish (confident reading skills in Ottoman archival materials and manuscripts)

• interest in Ottoman social and religious history

Furthermore, the following skills are desirable

- good conversational English skills
- familiarity with ethnohistorical research questions
- familiarity with research on Alevis and related religious traditions
- communication skills and willingness to work in a team
- additional language skills, e.g., Kurdish, Armenian, Arabic, Russian, French
- experience in research data management and methods of Digital Humanities
